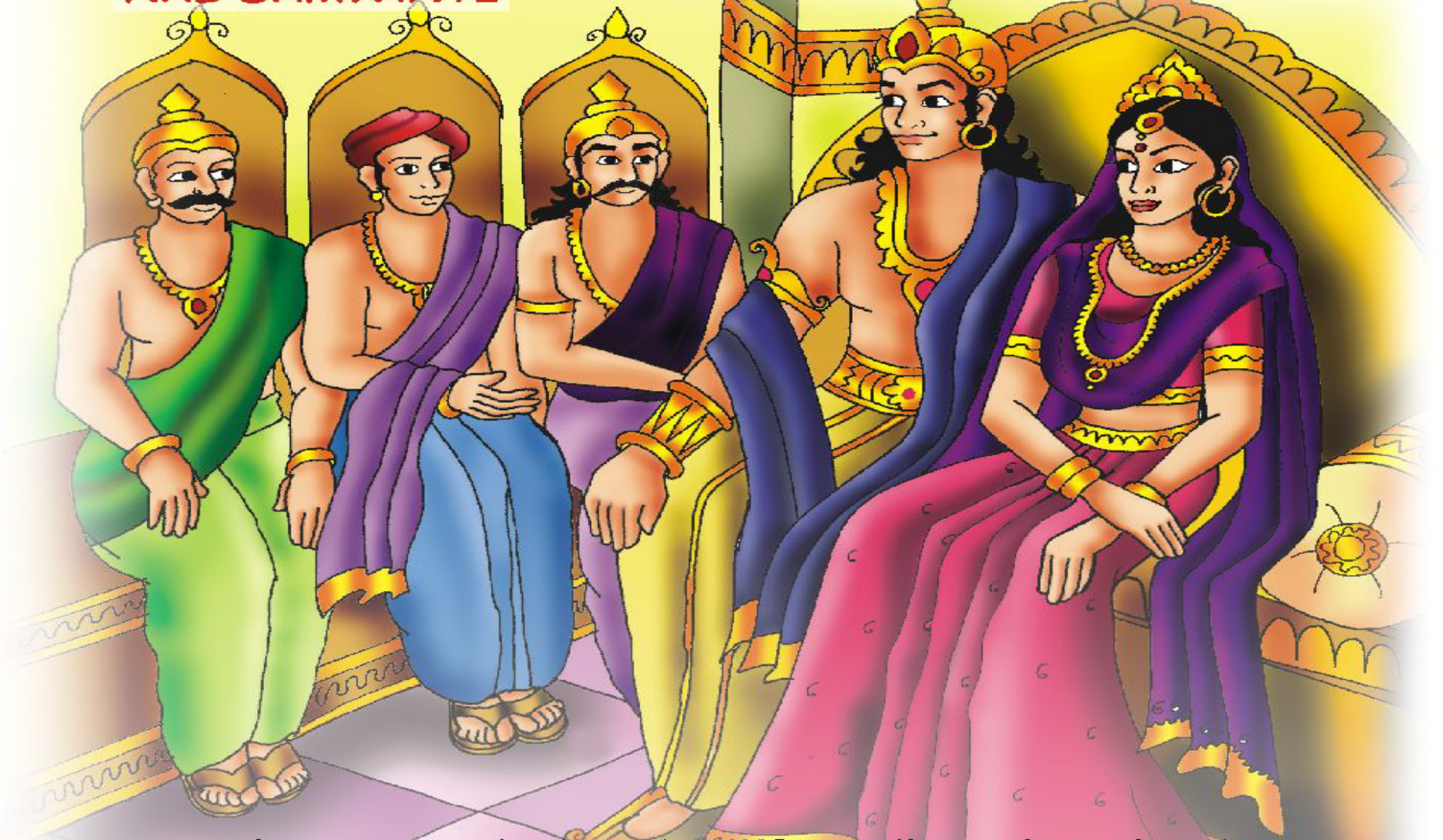
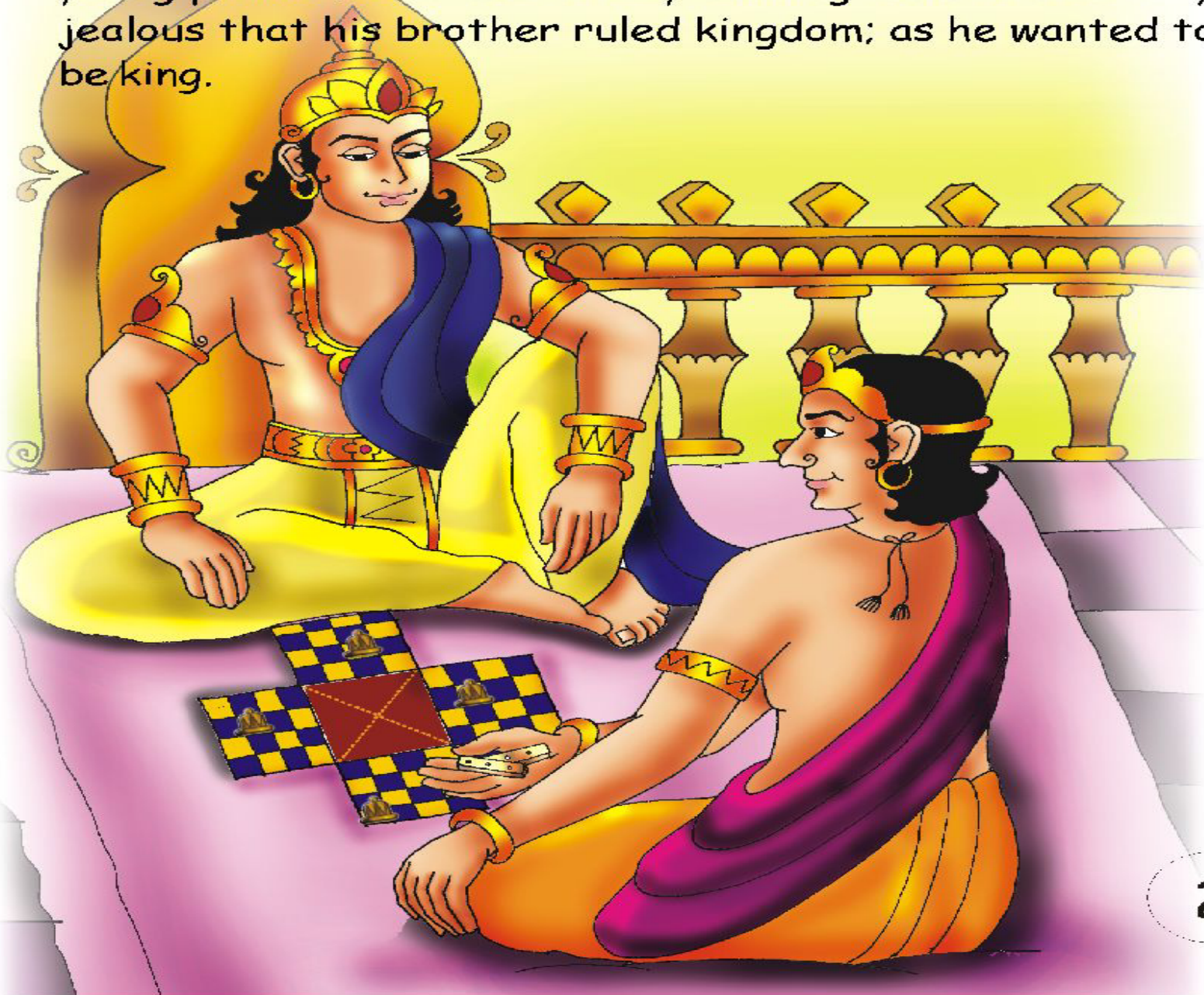


NAL DAMYANTI



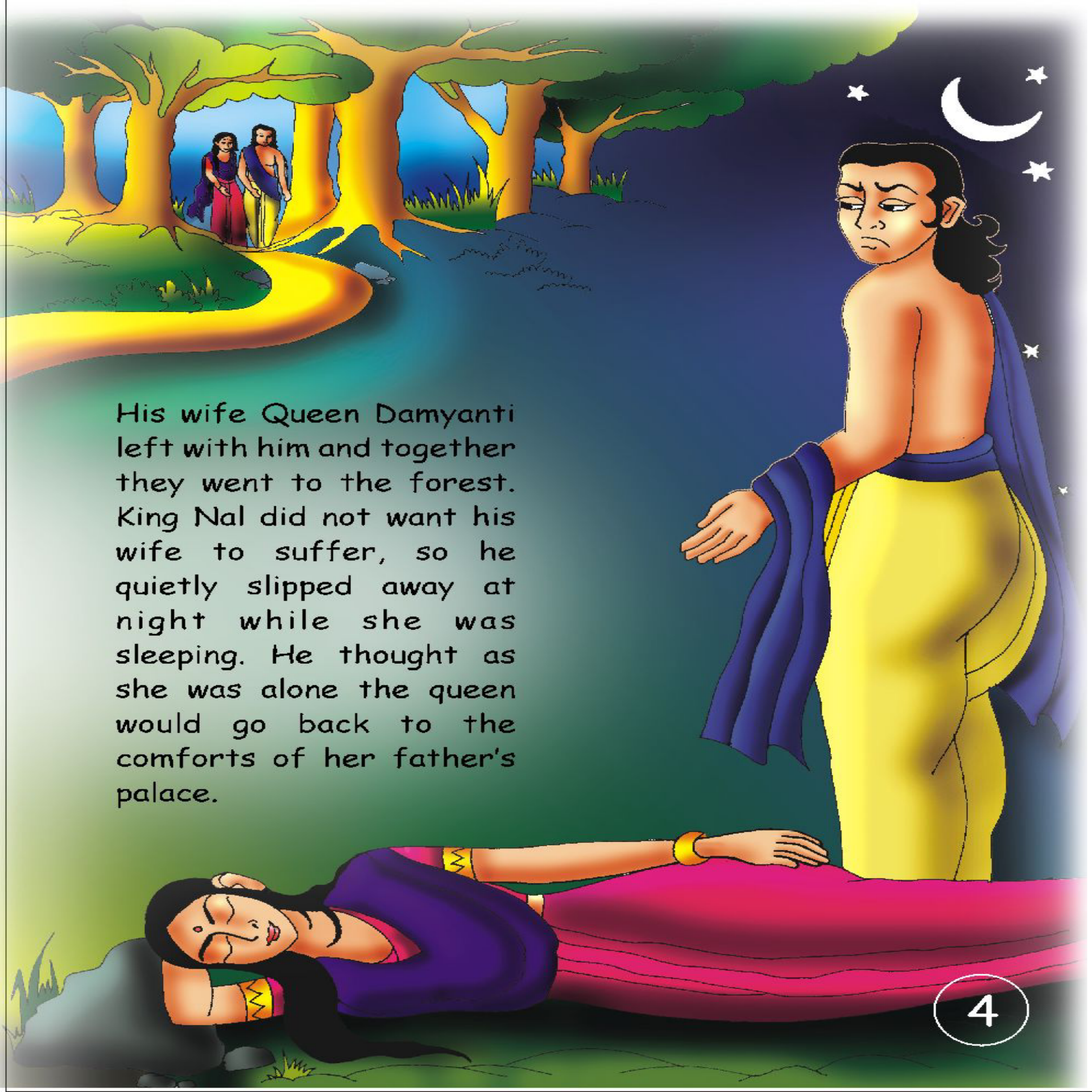


